



By-Law No. B – 50

A by-law to replaced by-law no. B-8  
For the Municipality of Hartland  
Respecting Community Emergency Planning  
For the Town of Hartland

The Council of the Town of Hartland, New Brunswick under the authority vested in it by section 10.3 (2) of the Municipalities Act and section 9 of the Emergency Measures act, and Regulations thereunder, enacts as follows:

Title:

This by-law may be cited as: Community Emergency Planning By-Law for the Town of Hartland.

Definition:

1. For the purpose of this by-law,
  - a. “emergency” means a present or imminent event in respect of which the Minister or municipality, as the case may be, believes prompt coordination of action or regulation of persons or property must be undertaken to protect the health, safety and welfare of the civil population, the environment and property.
  - b. “emergency measures plan” means any plan, program or procedure prepared by the Province or a Municipality, as the case may be, that is intended to mitigate the effects of an emergency to provide for the safety, health or welfare of the civil population and the protection of property and the environment in the event of such an occurrence.

Standing Committee of Council:

2. A Standing Committee of Council, hereinafter called “the Committee” shall be appointed by Council, to consist of not fewer than two members of Council. Two members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
3. In addition to its other duties and powers under this by-law, the Committee shall be responsible for:

- a. advising Council on the development of a municipal emergency plan
- b. the appointment of a director of the municipal emergency measures organization and such others as may be required
- c. the preparation and approval of the municipal emergency measures plan.

**General:**

4. Subject to the approval of Council, the Committee may negotiate and on behalf of the municipality enter into agreements with other municipalities, with the Government of the Province, with the Government of Canada, or with other agencies, or any or all of them, for the purpose of mutual aid; for the formation of joint organizations; or for the employment of their members or resources; all within the terms of a community emergency plan.
5. In the event of an emergency being declared, the municipal emergency plan will be implemented by the Committee in full or in part according to the procedures outlined therein.
6. A) In the event that an emergency has been declared, Council will be automatically convened and shall not be adjourned until the emergency is declared to be over.  
B) Each member of Council will be advised by the committee when an emergency has been declared and he/she shall advise the Emergency Operations Centre of his/her whereabouts during the continuation of the emergency.
7. In the event that an emergency has been declared, all employees, servants and agents of the municipality will advise the Emergency Operations Centre of their whereabouts and will be required to carry out duties as ordered by the Director of the Municipal Emergency Measures Organization. In this connection, unless Council otherwise stipulates, for service performed during the continuation of the emergency.
  - a. Department Heads will receive no additional remuneration
  - b. Salaried persons, other than Department Heads, will receive a pro-rata hourly rate for each hour worked.
  - c. Hourly paid employees will receive time and one-half their regularly hourly rate for time worked in excess of eight hours per day
  - d. Casual employees as required during the emergency will be paid the usual set rate per hour.
8. When an emergency is declared the Committee may forthwith procure food, clothing, medicines, equipment, goods and services of any nature or kind for use therein, the payment for which shall be made by the municipality.
9. For the duration of the emergency, Council may appoint as auxiliary police person who are recommended to it by the Chief of Police.
10. For the duration of the emergency, Council may appoint as auxiliary firemen persons who are recommended to it by the Fire Chief.

11. For the duration of the emergency, Council may appoint any other persons as deemed necessary by the Director of the Municipal Emergency Measures Organization.

By-Law Repealed:

12. All by-laws, rules and regulations heretofore passed, adopted and observed by the Councils of the form Town of Hartland by-law number B-8 "A Community Disaster Plan" is hereby repealed.

Effective Date:

13. This by-law comes into effect on the date of final enactment thereof.


