THE CARE AND CONTROL OF CERTAIN COMBUSTIBLE
FLUIDS WITHIN THE TOWN

A By-law Regulating the Care and Control of Certain Combustible Fluids Within the Town.

BE IT ENACTED: by the Town Council of the Town of Hartland as follows:

1. All visible gasoline pumps, that is to say, pumps with glass containers on the top thereof, and for the purpose of pumping such volatile and dangerous fluids as gasoline, naptha, benzoline and benzine, shall be drained by the owner or agent daily at such time as he shall close his place of business.
2. No person shall keep or store in or upon any premises any fluid or fluids, mentioned in Section 1 hereof, in any container or tank having a capacity in excess of five (5) gallons, twenty-two point seven (22.7) litres, unless the container or tank is buried at a depth of not less than two (2), point five (0.5) metres below the surface of the soil.
3. Section 2 hereof shall not apply to gasoline contained in the tank of any motor vehicle or internal combustion engine.
4. Any person guilty of any infraction of any provision of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00).
