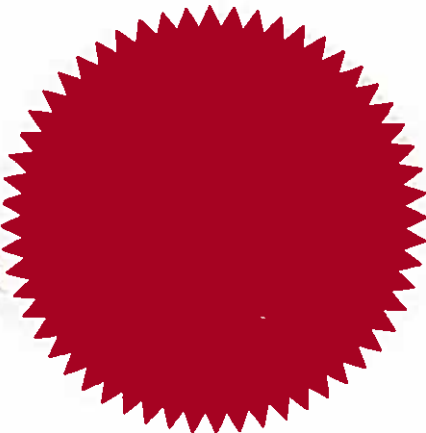

TOWN OF HARTLANDBY - LAWA - 1

A By-Law respecting the revision, consolidation, interpretation and repeal of by-laws of the Town of Hartland.

BE IT ENACTED: by the Town Council of the Town of Hartland as follows;

1. The general by-laws of the Town of Hartland shall be revised, re-organized and consolidated into five main sections, namely:
  - a. Administrative Ordinances
  - b. Regulatory Ordinances
  - c. Service Ordinances
  - d. Fire Ordinances
  - e. Police Ordinances
  - f. Animal Control Ordinances
2. The following by-laws are hereby repealed:
  - a. By-Law No.1 relating to the revision, consolidation, interpretation and repeal of by-laws in the Town of Hartland;
  - b. By-Law No.2 relating to Sunday Observance and Public Morals;
  - c. By-Law No.13 relating to the Relief of the Poor.
3. The present by-laws shall be renumbered as follows:
  - a. Government of the Council from No.2 to Section "A" No. 4
  - b. Regulation of Street Traffic from No.3 to Section "E" No. 2
  - c. Parking from No.3A to Section "E" No.2
  - d. Licences from No.4 to Section "B" No.1
  - e. Transient Traders, Peddlers and Labourers from No.5 to Section "B" No.2
  - f. Streets and Sidewalks from No. 6 to Section "C" No.1
  - g. The Water System from No.7 to Section "C" No.2
  - h. Sewers from No. 8 to Section "C" No.3
  - i. Fire Protection from No.10 to Section "D" No.2
  - j. The Keeping of Explosives from No.11 to Section "D" No.3
  - k. Firewood from No. 14 to Section "B" No.3
  - l. The Keeping of Dogs from No.15 to Section "F" No.1
  - m. Impounding of Cattle from No. 16 to Section "F" No.2
  - n. Duties of Town Officers from No.17 to Section "A" No.6

- o. Town Wards from No. 18 to Section "A" No.2
  - p. Composition of the Council from No. 18A to Section "A" No. 3
  - q. The Town Seal from No. 19 to Section "A" No.7
  - r. Care and Control of Combustable Fluids from No. 20 to Section "D" No. 4
  - s. By-Law to amend By-Law 20 from No. 21 to Section "D" No. 4
  - t. Nuisances and Civil Order from No. 26 to Section "E" No. 3
  - u. Zoning from No. 27 to Section "B" No.4
  - v. Subdivisions from No. 30 to Section "B" No.5
  - w. Planning Advisory Committee from No.31 to Section "A" No. 5
  - x. Building from No. 32 to Section "B" No. 6
4. In every by-law of the Town of Hartland, unless the context otherwise requires:
- a. "By-law" means a by-law of the Town of Hartland;
  - b. "Council" means the Town Council of the Town of Hartland;
  - c. "Councillor" means a councillor of the Town of Hartland;
  - d. "Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the Town of Hartland;
  - e. "Herein" used in any section shall be understood to relate to the whole of the by-law, and not to such section only;
  - f. "Mayor" means Mayor of the Town of Hartland or the person for the time being having the powers of or performing the duties of Mayor;
  - g. "Month" means calendar month;
  - h. "Person" includes any body corporate and politic, and their heirs, executors, administrators or other legal representatives of such persons;
  - i. "Shall" is to be construed as imperative and "May" as permissive;
  - j. "Street" includes highway, road, land, alley, avenue, drive, bridge, way of public nature, boulevard, court, courtyard, common, public square, park, and any other public place in Town;
  - k. "Year" means twelve consecutive months, and "Calendar Year" means the period from the first day of January to the last day of December then following inclusive.
5. In every by-law of the Town:
- a. a word importing the masculine gender includes the feminine and any corporation to which the context may extend;
  - b. a word in the singular includes the plural and a word in the plural includes the singular;

c. effect is to be given to the true spirit, intent and meaning of each By-Law and every part thereof.

6. Where a by-law creates an offense but does not state the penalty, everyone who commits a breach of such by-law is liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars.
